Casimir Douglas Zdanowicz, Sr. was a Professor of Modern Language and Literature at Vanderbilt from 1886 until his death in 1889. His son Casimir Douglass Zdanowicz, Jr. was a 1903 Vanderbilt graduate and became professor of Romance Languages at the University of Wisconsin. He died in 1953.
