The Divinity Library will be holding its next Database Open House Wednesday, March 30, 2005 from 1:10-2 pm in the Electronic Classroom (across the hall from the Divinity Library, through the Reserves Room.) These monthly training sessions are open to all Divinity and GDR students, faculty and staff.

The March Open House will cover searching through Google Scholar. Google Scholar is Google's new search engine for scholarly literature, and it provides access to books, journal articles, and citations. Topics covered will include how to conduct simple and complex searches, how to use the search engine to find where a book is located, and the citation feature offered by Google Scholar.
