

Universal Pictures announced it has





# 21st Century Illegal Immigrants Should Be Deported, Say Descendants Of 17th Century Illegal Immigrants

"Now, the descendants of these former Americans want to try and become American again, while the most recent Americans want to stop them."

As President Bush's controversial guest worker programme continues to be considered by Congress, a coalition of some of America's oldest-established families have come together to demand that illegal immigrants arriving in the US from Mexico be returned from whence they came. The group, calling themselves "Keep America WASP" (KAW), held a ceremonial inaugural rally at Jamestown. The rally took place by a monument commemorating the arrival of the first English settlers in 1607, who arrived to spread peace and liberty through the land using only the swords, guns and cannons they had brought with them.

T. Holden Worthington, chairman of the group, spelled out the group's basic message at the Jamestown rally. "I don't see why those of us who call this country their home should have to put up with the creeping invasion of unwanted foreigners into this continent, who bring with them nothing but disease and crime, who take our jobs and destroy our culture. The era of tolerating such things is over."

Worthington went on to read out what he claimed was a message of support from a local Native American tribal leader. "The very foundations of our country are under threat from these unwanted arrivals who yearly flood into our lands," reads the missive from Chief

Powhatan, "Our once proud nation is now ravaged by diseases we are not accustomed to; our people are attacked without provocation; rape, theft and murder are now frequent wherever these new immigrants

arrive: our very way of life is under threat, and our cultural traditions are being destroyed. In the name of Manitou, I appeal to the government of England to stop these people coming."

Some journalists questioned the context of this message, asking why it mentioned England and why

it appeared to date from 1624. Worthington explained the former as a "typo" and the apparent discrepancy in the date a result of "the inability of these savages to absorb the values of a western education."

Opposition to KAW comes from a somewhat unusual coalition of lib-

eral supporters of multiculturalism and business leaders supportive of cheap labor, but also, unsurprisingly, from Mexican-Americans and other recent immigrants. Juan Valdez, a Chicano cultural stereotype and

busboy now living in Houston, gave a response typical of many in the immigrant community. "I don't understand these 'WASPs," said Valdez, "We people of Spanish descent have been in what is now the US since before they ever landed here. Are we not Americans too? Why do they tell us we cannot be included in America today?" Jack

Jack Anderson, a Professor of Anthropology at the University

track of the term as it changes over time. The original Americans were Russian, and came through Alaska.

"Then in the 16th Century, the Spanish arrived, and started to become Mexican. Then the English, who were once Danish (of course, the people who originally lived in England were by now Welsh and on the way to becoming Irish), came over and began to take over as Americans. Of course, this meant that the existing Americans (from Russia) had to become Indian. It's important not to confuse them with people in India, who at this time were really Mongolian.

"Anyway, over the next few centuries, the original Americans stopped being Indians, and became Native. Meanwhile, the Mexicans (who used to be Spanish) had tried to become American by living in America, but then got conquered, so ceased to be American, or European (and thus became Hispanic). Now, the descendants of these former Americans want to try and become American again, while the most recent Americans want to stop them. Once you understand this, the immigration issue becomes pretty straightforward."

Or, to put it in the words of Old Greenwich resident and KAW member Jefferson Rockwell Lincoln, III, "The sooner those dark-skinned dagos realize this country wasn't intended for them and get the hell out, the better."

# 1200 Fans Cut From Men's Basketball To Meet Title IX Standards

Following the outcry over the turning away of several students from the recent Women's Basketball Game against Tennessee, Kirkland Hall has announced that it is taking steps to assure that the problem will not be repeated. Specifically, they plan to revisit the policy whereby only 1000 seats are allocated to students for the women's games while 2200 are held back for the men's.

"This blatant double-standard in the way we differentiate between the support given to men's and women's sports is going to create significant public relations difficulties for the University," said Vice-Chancellor for Student Life David Williams, "And as addressing anything related to the sports programs in a thoughtful and productive manner is far too time-consuming, I think the only fair thing to do is to equalize the allocations for the two teams. As a result, from now on, there will also only be 1000 seats available for the Men's Basketball matches."

Williams cited various justifications for his decision. "Firstly, it's a financial question," the Vice-Chancellor said, "Frankly, it is severely hurting the university's finances to provide these extra 1200 seats free of charge to our students. The \$180,000 we could raise from selling these seats as season tickets to the general public will provide us with valuable resources to spend on improving the quality of life for our students. Like redesigning the approach to the 9th green on the University golf course - boy, that dogleg to the right can be a bitch to get

around.

Williams further indicated that the money would help restore some health to Vanderbilt's finances, as with only \$3bn raised in alumni pledges last year, arguing that "we simply cannot afford to fritter it away on something so insignificant to campus life as the sports teams."

Finances are not the only reason behind the decision, however. The Vice-Chancellor claimed that the change could also be supported by mis-interpreting the intention of Title IX. "The principle of equality in college sports is something we should all support," Williams said, "it stands to reason that the best way to achieve this equality is by reducing the resources of well-established and popular men's sports rather than by committing further resources to raise

the status of currently less-developed women's sports."

In order to allay fears that this and other recent measures might undermine the position of athletics on the Vanderbilt campus, Williams said that this was not yet the end of his reform agenda. "Downsizing the men's soccer team led to some criticism that we were ignoring so-called 'global sports,' and I am determined to refute that charge. Accordingly, I am pleased to announce that from next season, the budget for the Football program, a sport which is really only played by a fraction of the globe's population, will be re-allocated to the Vanderbilt Cricket Club, as this is a sport played by billions all over the world. Now if you'll excuse me, I need to go and persuade Coach Johnson to tell the players."

### **The Slant Cancels Muhammad Cartoon Contest**

Following the *Slant*-based controversy of recent months and the eruption of violence in the Muslim world, *The Slant* has decided to cancel its contest to find the dozen most offensive caricatures of the prophet Muhammad.

The cancellation came after months of turmoil in Europe and the Middle East. The conservative Danish newspaper *Jyllands-Posten* published twelve caricatures of varying degrees of offensiveness, ranging from respectful to incendiary; several of the cartoons poke fun at Islam's treatment of women, jihad, and their lack of any sense of humor. Islamic traditions condemn visual depictions of Muhammad, especially ones that depict his turban as a bomb. Besides setting off a heated debate about the

boundaries of free speech and respect for diverse religious beliefs, the controversy has now denied *The Slant* a chance to artificially create demand for the publication.

"I have nothing but the utmost respect for this religion of peace," said *Slant* Editor-in-Chief CeafLewis in a written statement.

Despite the prudent self-censor-ship, *The Slant* has already received criticism for simply thinking up the contest. SGA President Kate Morgan issued the following statement: "*The Slant*, trying once more to be funny, has likened Islam to terrorism. This sort of student-funded intolerance must not be tolerated. The Student Government Association has nothing but respect for this peaceful religion." Lewis quickly pointed out that this was, in fact, *The Slant's* first attempt to be funny, the other times being merely happy coincidences.

Others argued for the publication's

hypothetical right to free speech. Sophomore Jon Brody said, "I have nothing but respect for Islam, and I'm glad they're not printing something so inflammatory. Don't get me wrong; free speech is a very good thing . . . just not when it could offend someone. Or when that someone could behead me."

Inflammatory Syrian cartoonist Ad-mur'l Ackbar said, "The cartoon using the crescent and star as the mouth and eye of the Prophet, peace be upon Him, was totally offensive and utter blasphemy." He then returned to drawing a cartoon of Ariel Sharon single-handedly fabricating the Holocaust.

Hustler columnist Chad Burchard had a different reaction. "His turban is a bomb?! Why didn't I think of that?!" He then added, "I have no respect for Islamofascist terrorists."

The Slant has also preemptively distanced itself from Iranian new-

paper *Hamshahri*, which is holding a Holocaust cartoon contest to test free speech limits in the West. "We wouldn't even know how to contact an Iranian paper, let alone have the kind of power to influence their content," said Lewis. "Not that we would influence them to do this. We didn't. I don't even speak Hindi. Wait, is that even what they speak over there? Oh, god, now I've offended Iranians."

Some good has managed to come out of the controversy. DKE Hazing Manager Deke Witherspoon said, "This whole phenomenon has really caused some hard thinking among the brothers. I mean, we thought 'Jailbreak' was the best theme party idea ever. But *The Slant* has created new opportunites for debauchery for us. Imagine what we would have to do to really pull off an incredible 'Blasphemy Bash!"

"Title IV. Removal from Office and Vacancies

Article I. Removal of Elected Officials Section I. Petitions of Removal

Upon receipt of a petition containing the signatures of ten percent of an elected official's constit-

uency, the Attorney General shall begin an investigation into removal of the official and shall report his or her findings to the Senate.

Section II. Votes of No Confidence

If the Senate shall by two-thirds vote show no confidence in an elected official, the Attorney General shall begin an investigation into removal of the official and shall report his findings to the Senate within two weeks.

Section III. Removal from Office

If three-quarters of the Senate shall decide after hearing the investigation report of the Attorney General that there shall be adequate grounds for removal from office, the elected official in question shall lose all rights, powers, and privileges of his or her office.

Section IV. Replacement of Elected Officials

After an elected official shall have been removed by the Senate, the Attorney General shall hold a special election in accordance with the Statutes within four weeks."


