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Ripken, Gwynn To Enter Baseball Hall of Fame As Yankees

Career Orioles, Padres Legends Co-Opted for Induction by Bronx Bombers

Cal Ripken and Tony Gwynn were elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame last week in their first year of eligibility for the award. Both players indicated that they would enter the hall as New York Yankees, despite never having played for the team.

"The Yankees are about excellence on the field," said Yankees owner George Steinbrenner. "And these are two of the greats to ever play the game. It's about time we saw them in pinstripes."

The two new inductees were excited after their selection, but getting the call from Steinbrenner was "the icing on the cake," said Gwynn. "I always wanted to be part of that winning tradition."

"I've served my time in this backwater town. It's time I started cashing in on my clean cut image," said Ripken. "I know this may come as a shock to the people of Baltimore, but I've seen how things have worked out for Mike Mussina, and I want to get some of that big city life."

Gwynn toiled for many pitiful San Diego Padre squads in his 20 years, losing the 1998 World Series to the Yankees. Ripken played 21 seasons for the Baltimore Orioles, including a heartbreaking 1996 ALCS loss to the Yankees and a blown fan interference call."Sure, these guys won, what, one championship combined? In 41 seasons?" said Steinbrenner, referring to Baltimore's 1983 World Series title. "I know that don't seem like they're the kind of winners that the Yankees are. But they're character guys we can use, especially after getting rid of [Gary] Sheffield." Sheffield was traded to Detroit this offseason; the Yankees officially cited an overabundance of outfielders, but an anonymous player confirmed that Sheffield, a notoriously moody player, "scared the living shit

out of everyone." Recruiting players of Ripken's and Gwynn's caliber should make fans forget the ill effects of Sheffield's tenure.

The players received \$8 million

since Roger Hornsby. Ripken famously broke Lou Gehrig's streak of consecutive games played, setting the new bar at 2, 632.

"It's a unique package," said ESPN

apiece for the right to be enshrined as Yankees. If the players meet certain performance incentives, including attendance at fantasy camps and speaking engagements, that figure could rise to \$11 million. The Yankees will also get to retroactively lay claim to the individual career accomplishments of the two players: Gwynn holds the highest career batting average of any player since Ted Williams and had five consecutive years of hitting above .350, the first such streak

baseball analyst and former Toronto GM Keith Law. "This gives hope to many of the other great baseball players of today who may not be fortunate enough to play for the Yankees what with 25-man rosters and luxury taxes on salaries."

Major League Baseball reversed its policy against selling enshrinement rights after Wade Boggs, a long-time Red Sox and Yankee player, was allegedly offered money to enter Cooperstown as a Tampa Bay Devil Rav.

"We've invoked the Yankee exception clause," said Commissioner Bud Selig.

Reaction around baseball and among fans was generally supportive. "I've talked to all the GMs around the league, and everybody is really happy for them," said Peter Gammons, hall of fame reporter for ESPN.

"This will be a win-win-win for the Yankees, Major League Baseball, and these players," said Kevin Kennedy, studio analyst for Fox Sports.

Yankee fans, too, are taking the players' switch in stride. "Eh, we're used to getting who we want," said Bronx deli owner Rocco Petrocelli. "So what if we hated their freakin' guts when they played for other teams."

Added Manhattan resident Ramon DaGama, "You could tell they were Yankee material underneath their other uniforms. Like Clark Kent and Superman."

Orioles owner Peter Angelos, however, is considering litigation to halt the ceremony. "I will put baseball out of business before I let our greatest baseball player retire a Yankee," said Mr. Angelos. "Or I will get an enormous cash settlement from my fellow owners and waste it on washed up veterans and crappy middle relievers."

If the move pays off, the Yankees will look to continue the trend. 2007 will be a quiet ballot year, but in the future, look for the Yankees to pick up soon-to-be Hall-of-Famers Greg Maddux, Manager Tony La Russa, innovative GM Billy Beane, and controversial sluggers Barry Bonds and Mark McGwire, who would both bring the top two single season home run records back to the Bronx.

In the meantime Steinbrenner is looking forward to the August induction ceremony. "I can't wait to rub it in everyone's face."






