






Australian Navy Pays for Female Sailors' Breast Augmentations

"I'd be all for changing the social dynamic around here, but I'm neither homosexual nor a homophobe, so there's really nothing I can do," said senior Stephen Halpern.

"I would totally love to help make Vandy more gay-friendly. Every little bit helps, too. For example, if someone was picking on my gay friend, I'd stick up for him," said juniorMatt Goodson. "Unfortunately, I don't really associate with too many gay people."



Holy Crap! I Completely Forgot Sept. 11 Actually Happened!


