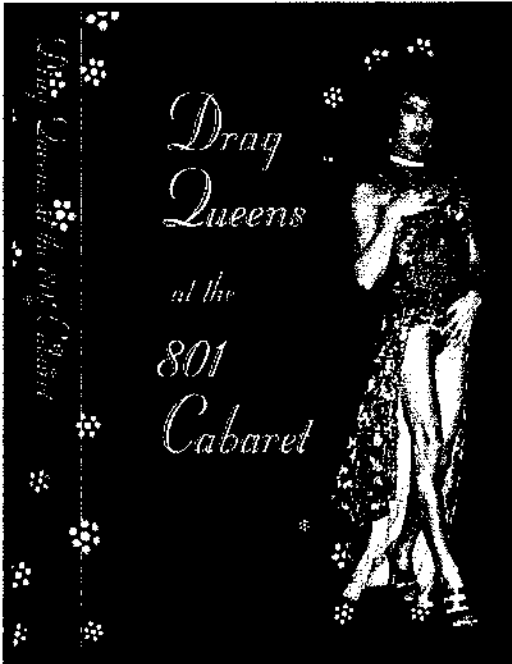

Her current research focuses on the women's movement and the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender movement. Her most recent book, co-authored with Leila J. Rupp, *Drag Queens at the 801 Cabaret*, looks at drag performance as a collective action repertoire of the gay and lesbian movement.
