
Crossing Genders: A M

A public lecture Monday, September 24, 4:10 p.m. 103 Wilson Hall, Vanderbilt University

In her book Crossing: A Memoir (University of Chicago Press, 1999), Professor Deirdre McCloskey recounts her experiences as a transgendered person who underwent gender reassignment surgery. Professor McCloskey will give a public lecture based on her book on Monday, September 24, at 4:10 p.m. at Vanderbilt University as part of the Gender and Sexuality Lecture Series sponsored by The Robert Penn Warren Center for the Humanities.

Deirdre McCloskey is Distinguished Professor of Liberal Arts and Sciences at the University of Illinois at Chicago and Tinbergen Professor of Economics, Philosophy, and Art and Cultural Studies at Erasmusuniversiteit Rotterdam. A leading

economist, Professor McCloskey is the author of numerous books in economic history and criticism, most recently Knowledge and Persuasion in Economics (Cambridge University Press, 1994), The Vices of Economists: The Virtues of the Bourgeoisie (University of Amsterdam Press and University of Michigan Press, 1997) and How to Be Human** Though an Economist (University of Michigan Press, 2000).
